Thomas Troward



- Livingness is ultimately measured by its intelligence.
- The higher the level of intelligence, the more control over the thing in motion.
- The very livingness of life consists in intelligence, which is the power of thought.
- Thought, then, is the distinctive quality of spirit, and the FORM of that matter.



Thomas Troward



- “The supreme principle of Life must also be the ultimate principle of intelligence.”
- Now, man must consciously participate in the creative activity of cosmic intelligence through the use of his own intelligence and volition.
- Underneath the specific forms there lies an essential undifferentiated unity which supports the individuality which arise out of it.



Thomas Troward



- The subconscious mind builds the body and is under the control of the objective mind.
- The ideal pattern of a thing is the **FIRST CAUSE**.
- Illness is but an externalization of the wrong belief that some secondary cause, which is really only a condition, is the primary cause.

- The function of the healer is to find entrance to the subconscious mind of the patient and to impress upon it the suggestion of pure health.
- We come into touch with the absolute “exactly in proportion as we withdraw ourselves from the relative.”

- “Make your assertion of opulence the last in your list, as you make love first.”
- She was a regular contributor for the Hearst papers, which added to her popularity.
- She was also strongly drawn to Spiritualism and gave much credit to Indian thought.

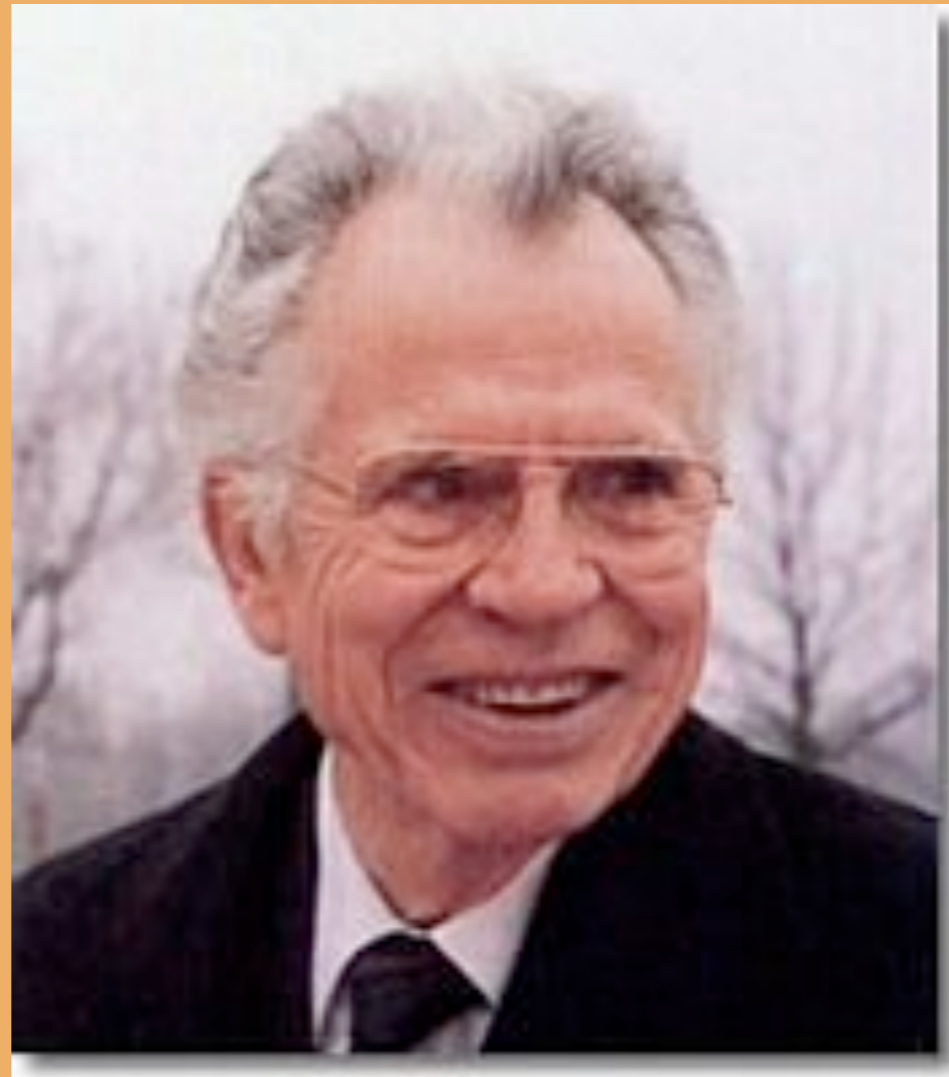


- Denied ordination by Unity (Lowell Fillmore)
